Fair City Chess Challenge

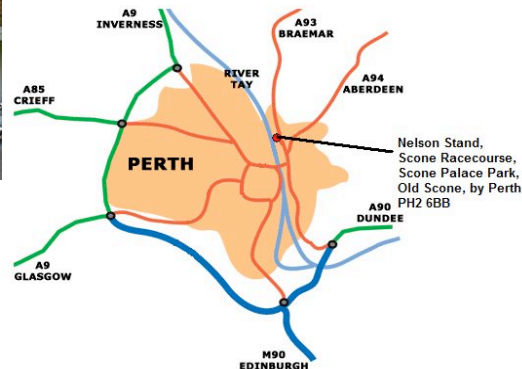

Directions

Coming from the South or the West you will approach Perth either on the M90 (from Edinburgh) or the A9 (from Stirling). Follow the signs to Dundee via the city bypass until you cross the Friarton Bridge which crosses the Tay just west of Perth. Take the first exit immediately over the bridge and follow the signs to Perth. Coming from Dundee you will travel west on the A90 and exit at the same junction before you cross the bridge

Continue along Dundee Road, this will become Main St, pass straight through the lights at the Bridgend junction. At the next set of lights veer off to the right, this will be the A93. Continue driving for approximately 3-4 minutes, shortly after the cottages on your right, turn right on to Stormontfield Road and watch for signposts to the Racecourse.

The Law Society of Scotland Secondary Allegro Team Chess Championships

In partnership with the Law Society of Scotland, we are pleased to announce a new event for junior chess players of Scotland. It shall consist of a one day allegro secondary team event, with 3 players per team.

We welcome all teams from throughout Scotland to this new exciting event. The event will be held in an excellent central venue at Scone Racecourse, Perth with modern playing facilities. In addition, we can guarantee a prize fund of over £500! The event is open to teams of all playing abilities.

The tournament is generously sponsored by the Law Society of Scotland who believe in the valuable life skills which chess can enhance. These include problem solving, critical analysis, improved concentration and, in respect of this event, team work!! The Law Society of Scotland also sponsors the very successful annual Donald Dewar Debating Championship and, by supporting this event, is encouraging participation in chess in secondary schools throughout Scotland.

Please note photographs will be taken at the event and may be used for publicity purposes.

Arbiters shall have the final decision on all matters relating to play. The organiser has the final decision on all matters and has the right to make any actions deemed necessary to ensure the smooth running of the event. Entry to the tournament is in acceptance of all the rules.

Tournament Information

Teams: Teams will consist of 3 players with all players attending the **same** secondary school. *In exceptional circumstances a team containing a player from a neighbouring school may be allowed to compete but prior discussion and the agreement of the organising committee is required. Such places will be limited and these teams/players will not be eligible for prizes.*

Prizes:

- 1st:** The Law Society of Scotland trophy to keep for one year
3 chess clocks and sets & cup for the winning school; £50 and medal for each player
- 2nd:** 3 chess sets and cup for winning school.
£30 and medal for each player
- 3rd:** Cup and 3 chess books for winning school
£15 and medal for each player

Slow starter: £10 per player for the highest scoring team with a score of less than 1 after the end of round 2.

Board Prize: The highest scoring player on boards 1,2,3. £10 (excluding players in teams placed 1st-3rd)

Girls Prize: £10 for the highest scoring female player (excluding players in teams placed 1st-3rd).

Entry fee : £15 per team, please make cheques payable to Chess Scotland.

Round Times: Registration 10.00—10.15 Round 4: 14.00— 14.50
Round 1: 10.30—11.20 Round 5: 15.00— 15.50
Round 2: 11.30—12.20 Prize Giving: 16.15
Lunch: 12.20—1300 Winners Photos: 16.30
Round 3: 13.00—13.50

Time Control: The time control shall be 25 minutes per player, per game.

Rules: All normal rules of chess shall apply at all times.

Grading: This event shall be allegro rated.

Note that all teams shall play in every round. The winning team will be decided by match points (2 points for a win, 1 for a draw and 0 for a loss). Game points shall be used in the event of a tie.

Please note there is no onsite catering and there are no amenities near the venue, however teas and coffees will be available. Please bring a packed lunch.
