

Financial Structure

Following an extensive review of the Finances of Chess Scotland, at the Council Meeting (March) and Management Board Meetings (April and June) Chess Scotland the following amendments and Fee increases are to be implemented effective with the membership renewals from 1st September 2017.

Background

The Chess Scotland finances can no longer support activities at the current rate of expenditure. The loss of financial support from the government grant in 2014 has been a major contributing factor in the depletion of our reserves. To address this, we will be making changes to the financial models of Chess Scotland, Membership classes, Fees, Magazine and services provided. Chess Scotland can no longer build finances around Sponsorship or Investors. These options, although being explored cannot be guaranteed, and can be withdrawn at any time and at short notice. The base financial model must be stable and allow Chess Scotland to match income and expenditure as well as building sufficient reserves to cover unexpected/unplanned events. It is also preferable that we achieve a stable membership fee structure that requires minimal increases to membership costs in future years.

Five-year Plan

Chess Scotland intends to adopt a 5-year finance reporting system that will reflect:

- 1. Previous 2 years accounts
- 2. Current accounts
- 3. Projected 2 year accounts

With immediate effect, all requests for Chess Scotland finances require to be authorised in advance and that a financial analysis of the projected spend be submitted with any such request. It may be necessary for Chess Scotland to develop a template form for said submissions. Chess Scotland will also adopt an approach where all events, adult and junior, must wherever possible, be self-financing.

Magazine

The production costs of the magazine were examined and it became clear that the costs outstripped the magazine income. It was therefore decided that we change to an eMag format and this change over will be from the October issue onwards. This eMag will be made available as a download to ALL Chess Scotland members from the classifications below from the website

Note: please also read the Fee changes since this change has an impact there.

By transferring to the eMag, the need for different Adult, Junior and Family memberships reduces and we will now offer the following Membership classes

- 1. Adult
- 2. Junior (U17) and Student
- 3. Family 2 adults + Juniors (U17)
- 4. Family Juniors (U17) only
- 5. Patron
- 6. Life
