INNOVATIONS IN THE INVITATION

A record number of 268 competitors are playing in 12 different Tournaments in this year's Glasgow September Weekend Congress. The Congress, The Pride of Scottish, not just Glasgow, Chess, represents the culmination of effort put in by a small team of enthusiastic workers for chess - workers who think nothing of long meetings and working until after midnight the day before the Congress, to ensure that everything is just right. You know their names for previous Tournaments - Messrs. Bonner, Beaton, Fitzjames, Holmes, Mannion, Munn. and Pursley. What is disappointing in Scotland is that no other Congress has been built up to the respected position the Glasgow Congress now has and we must surely hope that organisers elsewhere will be inspired to some greater effort for the promotion of chess.

We will be including in these bulletins all the games in the two invitation tournaments and hence, as there are both only 5 rounds, there will be only 5 bulletins. If, however, you are in another tournament and you feel your game is worthy of publication then please hand a score of the game marked BULLETIN to the recorder in the main hall. Also in the bulletins will be thumbnail sketches of the invitation tournament players, information on Scottish and Glasgow Chess and reports on the leaders in the various tournaments - and there will be news of a petition which you will be invited to sign in connection with Chess Publicity!

This year, as there are only five rounds, the number of players in the invitation tournament is just 12. And this is how they line up (Alphabetically!):

Leonard Barden Leonard Barden was joint British champion in 1954 and has represented England four times in the world team championship. He is chess editor of the Guardian and Evening Standard, the author of several books on chess, and one of the world's greatest authorities on openings.

Michael Fallone Was until a few years ago one of Scotland's most original, most active and best chess players, but since his marriage and move to Dundee, he has taken little part in competitive chess. With several good Olympiad Scores to his credit, we must hope that his return to strong chess will not be a passing phenomenon and that he may again take his place in Scottish Teams.

Max Fuller Max Fuller is one of Australia's top players who came to Britain after achieving a good score in the Lugano Olympiad. Of his many fine results in Britain his first at Whitby earlier this year is perhaps best.

Harry Golombek Harry Golombek is one of Britain's internationally renowned players. He has been British Champion on three occasions in 1947, 1949 and 1955. Author of many books on chess he has in recent years acted as arbiter at World Championship Matches.

Bryan Hunter Bryan Hunter has many good tournament performances to his credit in Scottish Events, with perhaps his winning the 1967 West of Scotland Championship the most significant.

Raymond Keene Was born in 1948 and at the age of 18 defeated the great Botvinnik. He was second in the 1967 World Junior Championship and in the 1968 British Championship.

He was recently referred to by Barden in his "Guardian" column as "their apparent" to the British title.

David Levy Scottish Champion in 1968 and representative in the Zonal International tournament (The first stage on the way to the world championship) in Portugal next month, and many other international appearances make David Levy one of Scotland's foremost players.

Roddy McKay Tenth in the world Junior Championship (above all the other U.K. Players) and winner of the Junior International Tournament held in Glasgow during June, Roddy McKay is, at 17 already one of Scotland's most experienced players and undoubtedly ranks in the top four.

Jim Montgomery Jim Montgomery made a fairly late entry to the Chess world with spectacular results in the West of Scotland Championship a few years ago and subsequently had excellent results in Junior International Tournaments.

Val Nye Val Nye is living in Paisley and helping its chess progress along. Whilst having no title to his credit, he has fared well in most tournaments. He has competed often and stopped many potential tournament winners in their tracks.

David Pritchard David Pritchard is one of England's leading players and has chalked up many good results, eg. First at Bognor Regis earlier this year.

Craig Pritchett Craig Pritchett is perhaps Scotland's most consistently good player with many fine international scores to his name. He ranks number one in the Glasgow League Grading List (which covers the whole of Scotland).

OPENING CEREMONY

The Congress was officially opened by Baillie William McCredie, Senior Magistrate of the City of Glasgow who welcomed our visitors to Glasgow and expressed his delight at seeing so many boys and girls taking part. He felt that, if this aspect of the city's life were given a little more publicity, the city might have a truer image. We were also glad to see on the platform Baillie James Allan, in whose ward Langside Halls are, and who opened the Junior International Tournament held in Glasgow in June this year.

We would like to offer our praise to Glasgow Corporation for their generosity not only in this tournament but in many other aspects of promoting Chess of which most players are perhaps unaware.
