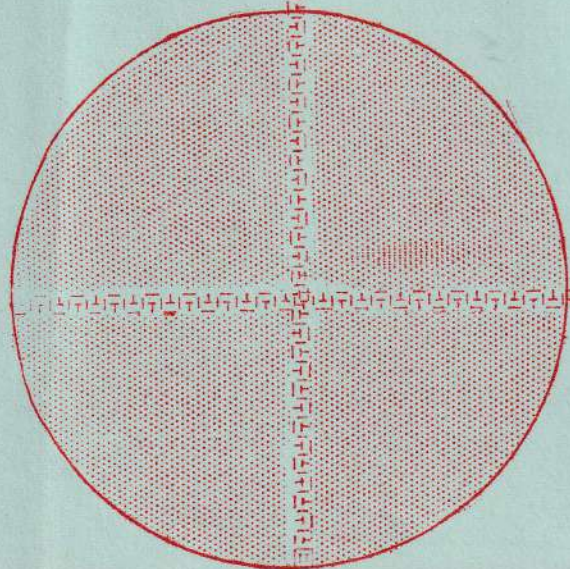

THE NINTH GLASGOW CONGRESS.

Yet again the congress has broken the Scottish record for the number of contestants at a chess tournament this time with a total of 297 players (almost over the 300 mark !) in 10 different tournaments, the largest being the OPEN with 60 contestants.. What makes this the most popular congress in Scotland can in no small way be a measure of the skill and enthusiasm of the Congress Committee - Messrs. Bonner, Beaton, Fitzjames, Mannion, Munn, Pursley and Wilson; and their fellow controllers - Anderson, Irving, Shaw and Watt.

The organisers seem to introduce new tournaments each year and 1970 is no exception. This years' innovation is the Junior International Invitation, held in conjunction with the Scottish Junior Chess Association.

Participants include nine members who represented their countries in the Glorney Cup Competition R.Bailey, R.Bellin and S.Saverymuttu (England); D.J.Findlay, E.J.Holt, M.Rosenberg and I.J.Sinclair (Scotland); D.James (Wales) and R.O'Hare (Ireland). These players plus J.D.N.Nunn from London and R.Bhopal and A.Radlow from Glasgow should make this tournament pretty lively.

This year, as in last years' congress, there are five rounds in the top events. We will be bringing out a bulletin after each of these five rounds, and these will include all the games from the two Invitation Events plus selected games from the other tournaments. If you feel that your game is worthy of publication then please hand a score of the game clearly marked BULLETIN to the recorder in the main hall.

And now to the INVITATION this is how they line up :

Leonard Barden Well it was all said last year but shall we repeat ? Leonard Barden was joint British champion in 1954 and has represented England four times in the world team championship. He is chess editor of the Guardian and Evening Standard, the author of several books on chess, and one of the world's greatest authorities on openings.

Martin Brodie Makes a welcome return to the Scottish Tournament scene. He has represented Scotland at several World Student Team Championships.

Les Blackstock Although a Scot Les has played little chess in Scotland, his only tournament in Scotland being the 1970 Scottish where he finished 4th equal. He played for Scotland in the last Student Olympiad, Haifa. Possibly his best result was only a few weeks ago when he finished first in a tournament at Marlow ... a tournament which included many of England's top players and most of their international team. He is co-editor with R.G.Wade of a new book on the Ruy Lopez which is to be published soon.

John Glendinning Many players wonder why John controls more and plays less for he was for a long time reckoned to be one of Scotland's top prospects. He captained Scotland's Glorney Cup team in 1965 when Scotland won the event .. for the first and only time to date ! On the organising side he is currently President of the Scottish Junior Chess Association.

Bryan Hunter With many good tournament performances to his credit and a number of good scalps (!) Bryan has been a regular competitor in the competition. His best performance to date must be his winning the 1967 West of Scotland Champ.

Victor Knox Has been extremely successful in many England Congresses, especially in the Northern Counties. His best result recently has been his first place in the very strong Manchester Open earlier this year.

Norman Littlewood is the only past winner of the Invitation present this year. Since his win, 1966, he has been fairly inactive. His return to the scene is to be welcomed, and it will be interesting if he has retained his strong attacking style.

Jim Lumsden This is his first appearance in the Invitation, and going by past performances should not be his last. He has represented Scotland in the Glorney Cup Competition.

Jim Montgomery When he plays pieces normally fly ! There is a story going around that last year when he played Harry Golombek, he told his opponent how much he had followed his books and how much he had taught him..... then with not so much as a wink crushed him in his favourite Dutch Defence System !

Tony Morgan An Englishman domiciled in Edinburgh won the Candidates last year with a score of 4/5. He has represented Scotland in a number of Student Olympiads.

Danny Wright Currently rated one of England's strongest players, his record both home and abroad being most impressive. He has played for England in the Glorney Cup, Student Olympiad and at senior level.

Nick Young Almost unheard of two years ago Nick has made a quick rise to top Glasgow standard. He was second in the Glasgow Zone of the 1970 West of Scotland Championship and has played for Glasgow in inter-league telephone matches.
