CONGRESS BULLETIN: Round-by-round bulletins, edited and published by W.P. Watson, giving all the games from the Invitation and Junior International events, will be on sale during the Congress.

BEST JUNIOR GAME: A prize for the best junior game played during the Congress will be given by the President of the Glasgow Chess League.

Players wanting to be considered for this prize should deliver to the Recorder's table, before 6.00 p.m. on Monday 28th September, a record, signed by both players showing:

- (1) and intelligible record of the moves made, and
- (11) tournament and round number.

GLASGOW GIRLS CHAMPIONSHIP: Tenure of the championship trophy for one year to the highest placed Glasgow girl in the Under-17 championship.

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TELEPHONE MATCH WITH SWITZERLAND

A telephone match will take place on Sunday 11th October 1970 commencing 12.00 when a team of ten juniors representing Scotland will play a team representing Switzerland. The Scottish team for the event will be nine boys from the following - Roddy McKay, Eric Holt, Michael Rosenberg, Iain Sinclair, David Findlay, Ian Meiklejohn, Donald Smith, David Itcovitz, David Bentley, Raj Bhopal, Graham Paterson and Alan Penman - and Miss Mary McGinn, and will play a similarly composed Swiss team. Spectators are welcome at the event (expected to finish about 5 or 6 p.m.) in the Conference Room of Robertsons (Scottish team venue), Golden Shred Works, Stevenson Street, PAISLEY.

- I. All games shall be played in the tournament rooms at the following times:-

(a) Invitation:

Main Sessions: 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. and
 6.00 p.m. to 10.00 p.m. on Saturday & Sunday
 2.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. on Monday

Adjournment Sessions: 2.30 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. on Saturday & Sunday
 10.00 a.m. to 12 Noon on Monday.

(b) Junior International
Open & President's:

Main Sessions: 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. and
 3.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. each day.

Adjournment Sessions: Commence 8.30 p.m. each evening

(c) Under-12 Championship:

9.30 a.m. to 11.15 a.m.; 11.30 a.m. to 1.15 p.m.;
2.30 p.m. to 4.15 p.m. ; 4.30 p.m. to 6.15 p.m.
each day.

(d) Other Tournaments:

Main Sessions: 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and

2. The rate of play shall be as follows:-

(a) Invitation: Not less than 40 moves in the first 2 hours and
 20 moves per hour thereafter.

(b) Junior International
Open & President's : Not less than 45 moves in the first 2 hours and
 20 moves per hour thereafter.

(c) Other tournaments : Not less than 40 moves in the first 1½ hours and
 20 moves per hour thereafter.

3. Any competitor who is not present within one hour after the time fixed for the commencement of a main session or for the resumption of an adjourned game will forfeit that game.

4. When a game is completed the following procedure is to be followed:-
 - (1) Re-set board.
 - (11) The winner of the game shall deliver to the Recorder a signed record of the moves made in the game. In the case of drawn games a record signed by both players shall be delivered to the Recorder. Competitors should note that the result of a game shall not be officially recorded until these results have been delivered.
5. If a game is unfinished at the end of a session and, provided the conditions of Rule 2 have been fulfilled, the next move of the player shall be sealed.
6. Competitors desiring to discuss and analyse their games must do so in the room provided for this purpose and not in any of the tournament rooms.
7. During playing sessions complete silence must be maintained by all competitors. Players contravening this rule may be penalised by the loss of their current games.


S U P P L E M E N T A R Y R U L E S

1. Do not play 5 - minute chess with the clocks. Such mis-use would be unfair to the owners of the clocks.
2. Competitors are asked not to enter the tournament rooms during the intervals between playing sessions.
3. Smoking is permitted in all areas but please use ash trays provided.
4. Shoes likely to cause damage to the tiled floors must not be worn.

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HOW TO GET TO THE CONGRESS:-

Langside Hall is located at the S.W. corner of Queen's Park, not very far from the City Centre. Buses numbered 21, 23, 29, 34, 38, 39, 45, 45A, 48, 48A and 57 stop near the Hall entrance.



Parking for about 100 cars is available within the grounds of the Hall. Cars may also be parked in Baker Street, Deanston Drive and Tantallon Road off Langside Avenue, opposite the Hall.

Scottish chess personality

MISS L M HOGARTH

talking to Harry Wilson

Listening to Miss Hogarth speaking of her lifetime of chess is fascinating when she recalls a whole world of chess experiences, and the many interesting people she has met across the board. She makes one feel that chess must be a game that attracts people of varied and interesting personalities, and that this should encourage young people to take up the game.

"I can't understand why more young people especially girls do not take up the game seriously" is a typical comment, and there is no doubt, as one listens to Miss Hogarth, that it must certainly add a tremendous amount to the experience of life.

One of a fairly large family who were not really interested in the game, Miss Hogarth was fortunate that her mother was a keen player, so she was taught the game as a young girl and this is something for which she will always be grateful.

In 1936 Miss Hogarth joined the Glasgow Ladies Chess Club, and progressed rapidly to play in the Scottish Ladies Championship in 1938, before the war, and since then she has become a well known and respected figure in Scottish Chess.

She has played on many occasions both in the Scottish Ladies and the British Ladies Championships, and can recall many interesting games in both these events. She has come first in the Scottish Ladies on several occasions, and in one memorable year finished first, ahead of her great rivals Mrs. Elder and Mrs. Steedman; in that year also she was equal third with Peggy Wood in the British. She also holds the Sir Robert Cranston Trophy which she has won six or seven times in the past years.

Miss Hogarth has a wealth of chess knowledge and can tell of many exciting games won and lost. One of her pet aversions is a horror of 'early draws' always feeling that something more could be done in complicated positions with the major pieces still on the board.

She has a deep liking for the game in its artistic sense, and a keen sense of humour, and is not above telling a story against herself. On one memorable occasion during an exciting game against Miss Anne Sunnocks at Whitby in the 1964 British Championships she agreed to a draw in an end game completely overlooking that her own position could produce a winning passed pawn.

There is no doubt that chess has given her great pleasure throughout her life, and she would like to encourage more people to play. To quote her own words "Chess is a rewarding game".






